# KING CAROL PROCLAIMS DICTATORSHIP AS HE OUSTS ANTI-SEMITIC GOGA

Replaces It By Coalition Headed By Patriarch Miron Cristea, Also An Anti-Semite; Anti-Jewish **Decrees Held Unconstitutional** 

Bucharest (WNS) - One anti-Semite succeeded another as premier of Rumania when King Carol dismissed the out and out anti-Jewish cabinet headed by his personal appointe, Octavian Goga, co-leader of the National Christian Party, and appointed in his place Partiarch Miron Cristea, head of the Holy Synod of the National Orthodox Church of Rumania, who took office with a coalition cabinet under a royal military dictatorship proclaimed by the King. The royal proclamation placed the country under martial law, prohibited all political parties, announced plans for "modifying the constitution and adapting it to the new needs of the country," and cancelled the March parliamentary elections. Goga issued an 11-page statement to the country entitled "Israel, You Are Victorious.

The immediate cause of the politicmania's 750,000 Jews as aliens and making them subject to deportation unless they could prove their right to citizenship by submitting a series of documents difficult to obtain to special citizenship revision boards was un-constitutional. The Juridical Committee held the decree illegal because it was aimed at only one class of citizens while the Constitution and the minority treaty of 1919, which is an integrate part of the Constitution, de-clares all citizens to be equal before the law, regardless of race or creed. By this decision the Juridical Committee also outlawed all of the other anti-Jewish decrees of the Goga cabinet which had begun to expel Jews from the professions and was forming then to liquidate heir business affairs at a rate that was creating an economic crisis.

Notwithstanding the fact that Premier Miron is an avowed anti-Semite and that King Carol himself is on record as upholding many phases of the anti-Jewish program, the new gov-ernment is expected to go slowly on the Jewish question.



## Welcome News

The announcement by the B'nai B'rith that it will soon organize a vocational service bureau for Jewish youth ought to be greeted with cheers. In recent years Jewish youth has been warned to avoid this or that profession or occupation because it is overcrowded. Parents have been cautioned not to encourage their sons and daughters to embark upon courses of study leading to such professions. Surveys have been made indicating in which professions and occupations Jews are concentrated. But little or nothing of an organized nature has been done to provide the necessary guidance for Jewish youth in the selecton of a profession or occupation.

As we understand it, the object of the new B'nai B'rith bureau will be to sponsor group vocational guidance. It will seek to utilize available research material, publishing it and disseminating it through the Hillel Foundatons, the Anti-Defamation League, the Aleph Zadek Aleph chapters and other agencies dealing with Jewish youth work. In other words the B'nai B'rith will set up a sort of clearing house for information on the subject of Jewish vocational guidance. Ultimately this bureau ought to serve not merely as an information center but also as a research agency in a field that has been too long neglected by American Jewry.

## Youth Aliyah

When the historian comes to write about how world Jewry in the third decade of the 20th century dealt with the problem of the refugees from Germany he will be obliged to give more than passing attention to the Youth Aliyah. It is just four years since 60 German Jewish boys and girls, ranging in age from 15 to 17, put foot in Haifa and entrained for the cooperative colony of Ain Harod, thus launching an unparalled youth migration. This first group to be taken from Germany to Palestine by Youth Aliyah has since grown to more than 2,000. A year ago Youth Aliyah undertook to do the same for he youth of Poland and is even now considering extending its work to Rumania.

Committees in 19 countries have cooperted in furthering this unique piece of uman salvage. In this country Hadassah has made Youth Aliyah its special project and has raised \$268,000 for this purpose. Youth Aliyah not only arranges for the mi-

gration of these young people but once they have reached Palestine provides for their general education for two years and gives them practical training in agriculture and technical occupations and instruction in Hebrew and Jewish literature and history, and houses and maintains them. Already 800 boys and girls have been graduated from the two-year training course, 75 percent of whom have remained on the land and organized themselves into cooperative groups.

Youth Aliyah is now beginning its fifth year. It is no exaggeration to say that this Jewish youth emigration program is one of the most constructive phases of the program of aid for the German Jews. It is to be hoped that funds will be forthcoming to enable Youth Aliyah to expand its activities in order to enable it to care for many more young people not only from Germany but also from Poland and Rumania.

## Tale Of Two Countries

Last month we noted the fifth anniversary of Hitlerism in Germany; this week, less than a month later, we celebrate the fifth annual Brotherhood Day of the National Conference of Jews and Christians. That these two unlike reflections of the world scene should be so coincidental is significant. The one sets the seal of doom on German Jewry; the other is one of the brightest spots on the American horizon. This study in contrasts raises two questions that American Jewry would like to have answered: "Why Hitlerism?" and "Can It Happen Here?". Unquestionably, Nazism in Germany was born of deepest despair and the false hope held out to the people by a mustached messiah. Obviously, there has been no such despair here. So far so good. The answer is: It can't happen here. But what of a sustained depression and the emergence of a Huey Long or another demagogue who would use the Jews as a scapegoat? What steps can we take to protect ourselves? Influence and achievements, as the German Jews discovered, were of no avail. What then? Possibly an enlightened America, an America intellectually immune to the virus of hate, could withstand a demagogue's empty mouthings, his false promises. Possibly an American 100 percent sold on democracy would be a bulwark against anti-Semitism, against Communism, against Fascism.

He had attended the lecture of Rabbi Joachim Prinz (recently Berlin) who had spoken in the temple on "Now I Can Tell the Truth."

"One paragraph (of Rabbi Prinz's speech) particularly impressed me," Dr. Rich's letter said. "'In Germany (Rabbi Prinz said) Jews can not enter restaurants, they can not enter the theaters, cannot patronize hotels. They can not enjoy public parks their children are segregated in the schools and they are forbidden to en-joy public playgrounds.'"

"Now, of course, this discrimina-tion is diabolical, but the reason I am writing to you is that so many Jewish friends I have are as toler-ant in regard to the Negroes in this country as the Nazis are against Jews. It seems to me that a group of people who are being persecute in nearly a score of countries would have compassion and sympathy for Negroes who are so notoriously discriminated against in America. Yet this is not the case.

"I knew Jews who defend theaters, restaurants and hotels which refuse to admit Negroes. In fact these Jewish friends of mine say, 'a nigger is all right as long as he stays in his

At first glance it might not seem that the work of a surveyor is in any way related to the career which later became Washingon's the career of a great soldier. Yet it was in the Virginia backwoods that young George learned to observe all those little details which a surveyor must and which a general must keep track of if he is to lead his army to victory. He was interested in military science, and used to borrow books about it which he would study in his spare time. So that it really was no acc that he became his country's leader when war cam

George had been interested in military games from his earliest boy-hood. In that country where the white settlers had to be constantly prepared for Indian raiders it was natural for

boys to play at war games, one side representing the white men, the other side the Indians. And even when he was a very small boy George usually was chosen to be the leader of his side, for his playmates quickly discovered that this boy knew how to lead even a play-army. Later, after he left school but before he became a British navy, and even went so far as to enlist as a midshipman on a British warship. His trunks were already on board, and the ship was nearly ready to sail, when his mother's tears persuaded him to withdraw from the navy and engage in a more peaceful pursuit.

Later, of course, when Washington, a grown man, offered his services to Governor Dinwiddie-who needed an expert woodsman to investigate what the French and Indians were doing in the wild country on the Ohio River-his mother no longer objected. But she never could develop any enthusiasm for her son's military achievements. She lived to see him the general of the army which won such great victories at Trenton and Princeton, but when friends congrat-ulated her on being the mother of such a son she simply said, according to reports: "Ah, dear me! This fight-ing and killing is a sad thing! I wish George would come home and look after his plantation!"

What Washington did once he had become an army officer is history which you have learned in school, so Mr. World need not go into it here. But he does want you to remember-on February 22nd, when the welcome respite from school duties will give you plenty of time to think of the Father of our country-that Washingon, like Lincoln, was prepared for his great tasks by having to do some very difficult jobs in his youth (if you don't think so, just you try being a surveyor in a wild and unknown country). And if ever your own work seems too difficult for you, just keep in mind that only the overcoming of difficulties in your youth can prepare you for great deeds in time to come.


you have to go there, They have to take you in.

There is no other homeland for any people.


