NAZIS DROP USE OF TERM

"ARYAN"

Berlin (WNS). — The term "Aryan," which in Nazi parliance has become synonymous with anti-Semitism, was officially abandoned by the German government, the first to erect it into an official policy, when Minister of the Interior Wilhelm Frick announced that the use of the word "Aryan" would be discontinued in new laws issued by the ministry. The change was explained on the ground that "Aryan", in linguistic terminology, is inexact, since the people of "non-A.yan" races may speak "Aryan" languages, and vice versa. In place

Lauds Personal Efforts of Myron C. Taylor For Success of Conference

NEW YORK.—Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national campaign chairman of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee, who attended the International Refugee Conference at Evian, France, as an unofficial observor, attributed that conference's success to the personal efforts of Myron C. Taylor, chairman of the American delegation.

Rabbi Wise's statements were made to ship news reporters who interviewed him on his return July 21 aboard the S. S. Nieuw Amsterdam. He is shown above with Mrs. Wise who accompanied him on the voyages. As a result of the leadership of the United States which Rabbi Wise described as "manna from the heavens to the democracies of Europe and South America", and the personal efforts of Mr. Taylor, the conference marked "the beginning of a new era in the rise of democracy from its humiliating deference to world tyrants," Rabbi Wise said.

The principal achievement of the conference, according to Rabhi Wise was in its "sounding a note of humanity and protest against the problems arising out of the actions of a totalitarian government. It was remarkable that thirty nations came together and practically agreed that the problem was one of humanity and not the concern of a few groups of people."

While the Joint Distribution Committee was the only American private agency to be represented at the conference, it offered no advice. It did, however, pledge its utmost support to the conference's program of refugee aid.

MUSSOLINI WILL CONTINUE PLANS DESPITE WARNINGS OF POPE PIUS

Fascist Press Says Racist Not Necessarily Anti-Semite; Jew-Hater Named Head Of Race Bureau

Rome (WMS)-While Premier Mussolini and Pope Pius moved headlong toward what all observers agree is due to be a major clash over Italy's new racist policy, Italian Jewry read with great interest an assertion in the newspaper La Tribuna, one of the leaders of the racist campaign, that racism must not be confused with anti-Semitism. Answering the Pope's thrice-repeated warnings that racism and exaggerated nationalism were anti-Catholic ings that racism and exaggerated nationalism were anti-Catholic and his blunt accusation that in adopting Aryanism Italy was imitating Germany, Il Duce told a meeting of Fascist party officials at Forli that "to say that Fascism has imitated anyone or anything is simply absurd." In answering the Pope, Mussolini also declared "I wish you and every one to know that also in the race question we will go straight ahead." His use of the phrase "we will go straight ahead" is regarded as highly significant because it has become a Fascist slogan for hurling defiance at all opponents.

JEWISH DOCTORS BANNED

Nazis Act to Deprive Physicians Of Licenses to Practice

BERLIN, Aug. 2—(AP)—All Jew-ish physicians in Germany are to be deprived of "approbations"—licenses to practice-by an order published in the official Reichsgesetzblatt tonight.

The order briefly states that from Sept. 30 all such licenses will become void. The order adds that in exceptional cases maintenance grants may be allowed Jewish physicians provided they served at the front in the World War. The number of Jews this new drastic decree affects is esti-mated at between 6000 and 7000.

NOT WANTED

Shortly after the Poles, Hungarians, Slovaks and Ruthenians in Czechoslovakia joined the German minority in the Sudeten (Nazi) area in demanding national autonomy the Jews of Czechoslovakia also advanced a claim for a similar status. But before this claim could receive consideration, tre Jews suddesly abandoned it. William Zuckerman, in his revealing article in the affiliated publications of the Seven Arts Feature Syndicate, explained why.

The fundamental basis of national autonomy, as stressed in the draft of the new Czech nationalities statute, is proportionate representation for each nationality in the country's economic, cultural, and political life. Under this system the Jews, who form four percent of the total population, would be entitled to four percent of all government positions as well as industrial, commercial, professional and agricultural posts. But, as Mr. Zukerman points out, while Jews do not occupy four percent of state positions, they do occupy 70 percent of the Commercial and professional positions. Thus, if the Jews insisted on a strict status of national autonomy they would gain in government positions and in public support of their schools but they would at the same time be limited to four percent of commercial and professional positions, thus undermining their economic

The danger inherent in the demand for Jewish national autonomy was recognized by the Czech Jews rather belatedly but they have now decided that complete civil and political equality is preferable to national autonomy. Mr. Zuckerman scored a bull's eye when he remarked that Jews "are citizens of the states we live in, not a separate national group. National differentiation and separation even of the most positive kind work out to our detriment."



Vienna (WNS) - Taking advantage of the panic in Jewish circles of the Nazification in growing out Austria, Christian missionaries are naking thousands of converts. Dr C H. D. Grimes, chaplain of the British Church in Vienna, is reported to have baptized no less than 500 Jews in recent weeks. The proselytes are of all ages. Some Causes of Anti-Semitism In England

A sudden rash of anti-Jewish timent. seemingly un-relate to Mosley's Fascist movement, is now giving British Jewry plenty cause for worry. Mr. Zukerman riewing the situation on the spot, examines its causes and advances number of significant res

English Jews have lately been un pleasantly surprised and disconcerted by unmistakable signs of a considerable anti-Jewish sentiment which seems to be spreading in England and making headway in many parts of the country and among different strata of society. As yet the sentiment can not be described as a strong anti-Semitic feeling, still less an organiz-ed anti-Jewish movement. But it is something sharp and unpleasant; something which makes Jews in England feel quite uncomfortable and ap prehensive. Perhaps the manifestaion may be accurately classed as the forerunner of anti-Semitism, the herald of a movement which may never come, but the thought of which is nevertheless pervading the country and corroding people's minds.

This manifestation is not to be cor with Mosley's Fascist movement which, a few years ago, made so much noise in England and in Europe. That danger is now smaller than it has ever been. Sir Oswald Mosley's movement can be put down definitely as a failure. What one notices in Engand now has no apparent connection with that movement, although it may flow secretly from it. It is something altogether different; something no extreme, dark and dangerous; not o bitterly conscious of its anti-Jew sh aims and purposes, certainly not to well organized, but more widepread and not confined to Fascist or ven to purely Conservative elements. As usual in England, one sees the first signs of it in the press. Suddenly, by some official inspiration everal of the more reactionary and sensational newspapers in London have started to publish articles about ews with an outspoken anti-Semitic ias. Stupid stories about Jewish dope mugglers in England; about refu doctors who inundate Great Britin and deprive the native practitioners of a living, and similar obvious products of anti-Semitic propaganda save begun to find their way into London newspapers. The alarming eature of this propaganda is that it as made its appearance not in the columns of obscure sheets like Mos ey's 'Action', but in some of the leading London dailies. Even such popuar newspapers as the London Even-Standard and Sunday Express (papers of the type of the Hearst publications in America), published bitter and stupid attacks on the Jews at the very time when the Nazi atro-cities in Vienna reached the height of their brutality and sadism.

It is not easy to account for this disconcerting manifestastrange tion in England, particularly at the present moment. Whatever fault one may find with the English, they are kindly and not ungenerous people. It not in the English character to kick a man when he is down. Yet, it was at a moment such as this that

On the very day when it became known the Austrian Nazis had issued a decree forbidding every kind of employment to Jews, even by Jewish firms the Evening Standard, the leading London evening newspaper, publish-ed a scurrilous attack on the Jews based on that very news report. According to the Evening Standard, it was not the Austrian Nazis who were to be blamed for that most inhuman measure ever undertaken by a Government in modern history; (a measure, incidentally, so brutal that even the Nazis subsequently repudiated it officially); but the Jews, because they shout too much when they are at-tacked; they make too much noise about their troubles; they are joining Left parties, and generally they are an unpleasant lot. The implication was that the Nazis were more or less justified in their inhuman treatment of the Vienna Jews. And this at a time when the Nazis had just dealt one of the cruelist blows to an entire community, and when eight hundred Jews had committed suicide in one

One is not used to such a mea small and ungenerous attitude on the part of the English. It is an alarmsign of the brutalization of the whole of Europe that a great news paper in London could so viciously and brutally kick victims of oppresion at the moment of their greatest lespair. What is responsible for this strange atmosphere prevailing now in a good many British circles? What causing this ever growing sadistic attitude towards Jews on the part ven of decent people who are ike the Mosleyites, professional anti-Semites? A number of minor and one major reason can, in the opinion of he present writer, be enumerated.

The chief of the minor reasons is he example of Nazi Germany. The of a great state in the centre of Europe maintaining for more than ive years a terrible campaign of perecution and vilification of a people having a brutalizing effect not only

on backward countries like Poland, Rumania and Hungary, but also on more civilized peoples. One of the evils of arena fights, bull-fights, cockights, prize-fights and other such spectacles is that the spectator be comes brutalized no less than the participant in the brutalities. Sadism pecomes a habit, almost an accepted thing. This is the penalty which the non-German part of Europe is now paying for its toleration of Nazism.

Another reason is the unfortunate publicity which Jews have of late received in the non-Jewish press as a result of the Nazi terror. I have had to write on this subject fully in a previous article, the gist of which was that the publicity which we are hav-ing in the world-press since the rise of Nazism, is on the whole not working out in our favor. Politically, it may serve to help the immediate victims of persecution by drawing the world's attention to their suffering but this exaggerated attention in itself is having a pernicious psychological effect on the average non-Jew Many people who were never aware of a Jewish problem before suddenly become 'Jew-conscious' and this is a sure step towards anti-Semitism.

A third of the minor reasons is loubtless. the reactionary political trend which prevails in England and n France at the present moment. The present National government in Engand is not Fascist, not even definite y pro-Fascist, but its sympathies are with the Fascist more than with the lemocratic states. Prime Minister Chamberlain himself, may probably is, a democrat at heart, but he bulk of his supporters, the great elies, is definitely more in favor of he dictators than of democracies. The class element is now very strong n English politics, far stronger than the national element. The forces of reaction are in the saddle and their spirit rules not only the foreign policy of the government, but to a great extent, also the country as a whole.

This spirit is fundamentally Fascist and as such also anti-Semitic. Anti-Semitism is so much a part of general reaction that whether the reac tionaries themselves want it or not, anti-Jewish feeling always pops up whenever they are in power. At least this is true of present-day reaction which is strongly permeated with Fascism and Nazism. English reactionaries cannot wax enthusiastic a bout Mussolini and Hitler and avoid anti-Semitism. The anti-Left feeling and the anti-Jewish feeling go hand and the anti-jewish recting go natu-in hand especially at present and no amount of good will to the Jews and humanitarianism can separate them. When Mr. Chamberlain's supporters in the House of Commons to express their support of his Span

iah policy, they shout, almost invol-untarily, to a Jewish member of Parliament, 'Go Back to Poland.' The same is true of the reactionary British press. It means to express its sup-port of Franco, Mus:olini and Hitler, and gives vent to anti-Semitism. Anti-Jewish feeling has become a fashion-able sign of die-hard Conpervatism the world over, including England. The popular reactionary British press scents the tendency and gives expression to it.

But there is one other major reas on for the growth of anti-Jewish feel-ing in England, France and other Western-European countries at pres ent, one which obscures all other reas-ons. This is the Jewish refugee ques tion. But this is a question so vast and so all-important that it must be treated separately in another article.

of political demagogues.

The author analyzes the condition. that affect the well being of youth. First, there is lack of equality of opportunity. The economic status of the father will invariably determine the future of the young person. Families belonging to the lower brackets are larger than those in the higher brackets; almost twice as many homes are broken among the poverty-stricken as among the financially secure; and twice as many youth from poor families want to leave home than do those from well-provided families. Of the youth whose fathers were laborers more than eight times as large a number left school before sixteen to seek employment than the ones whose fathers were professional and tech-nical workers. Thus the author force-fully declares: "As things now stand, the chances are about three to one against a young person, whose father is in one of the lower income jobs, rising to the white-collar level. And the chance that the child of a whitecollar worker will not drop to the low-est occupation levels is better than

four to one."

The second cause for the youth problem is lack of employment possibilities. From forty to forty-six per cent of the youth have never obtained full-time employment and about thirty per cent are totally unemployed. Considerable time elapses between the period they leave school and find work: three and half years for the one who quits school before sixteen, sixteen months for the high school graduate, and six months for the col-lege graduate. Working hours are reported to be long and monotonous; wages are inadequate for a substant-ial existence. The estimated annual earning of all youth is \$674. Similarly, there is a discrepancy between jobs youth want and the jobs they get." More than fifty per cent of the youth who left school upon completion of the sixth grade call their jobs "dead-ends." Even the college grad-uates are discontented; seventeen per cent envisage a dismal future.

Third, there is too much of a conflict between the learning in school and the experience in the world of affairs. "Youth are prepared for colleges they will never enter, are trained for jobs they will never find, and have tastes developed that quickly become atrophied," the report states. The fact that only four per cent have

The English theologian and rabbin ic scholar, R. A man is a better citizen of the United States for being also a loyal citizen of his state, and of his city; for being loyal to family, and to his profession or trade; for being loyal to his college or lodge. SONS AND DAUGHTERS OF J. W. V. TO HOLD FIRST NATIONAL CONVENTION





Detroit: Five thousand members of the Sons and Daughters of the J. W. Haavaramark Remittances Now Also To Former Austria

About Two Million Marks Sold More Than 15,000 Remittances Already



sufficient funds out of Germany to permit emigration.

The manner in which the "Haavaramark" system of remittances works is explained in the accompanying chart. A buys Haavaramarks with U. S. dollars to be sent to B in Germany. These Haavaramarks are paid to B from an account into which C (Jew who wants to emigrate from Germany) has paid his Reichsmarks. C, after leaving Germany, collects his money from a special trust fund held outside of Germany, to which A's dollars from USA have been transfer-

Haavaramarks sell today at about half the official Mark rate. They have the sanction of the German government and can be obtained at most American Banks, at Travel Bureaus, and at any office of the American Express Company.

A representative of Intria, Ltd., stated that the leading Jewish Organizations of the United States regard the Haavaramark as a boon both o the needy Jew in Germany and to the prospective emigrant.

Tisha B'Ab (ninth day of the Hebrew month Ab) is a day of mourning during which Jews fast and be-wail the destruction of the Temple and Jerusalem centuries ago. The day has always been considered a day of misfortune for Jews. Great national calamities happened on that or so close to that date that they were associated in the minds of people as all happening on the same date. The Tal-mud states that God decreed that particular day as a day of woe and trouble in the very beginning of Jew-ish history. According to this inter-pretation, the ninth of Ab was the day when the Jews, in the desert of Sinai, bewailed their lot when the spies brought back bad tidings from Canaan. So God declared: "you cried without cause; I will therefore, make this an eternal day of mourning for you." It was then, says the Talmud, that the decree was ordered for the destruction of the Temple and the scattering of the Jews amongst the peoples of the earth.
