JEWRY PREPARES TO OBSERVE SACRED DAY OF ATONEMENT

Kol Nidre Will Usher In Yom Kippur On Tuesday Evening — Local Congregations Issue Service Announcements

The plaintive music of Kol Nidre will usher in Yom Kippur on the Day of Atonement, at sundown, Tuesday, October 4th. On this holiday, the most solemn occasion in the Jewish year, devout Jews abstain from all food and drink and spend the day in the synagogue in prayer, meditation, and supplication for forgiveness. From biblical days, when this holiday was the occasion for special sacrifices and prayers in the Temple, Yom Kippur has carried with it an irresistible appeal for all Jews. It brings to a close the ten days of penitence which began last week on Rosh Hashonah, the Jewish New Year and its conclusion marks God's forgiveness for past sins and His blessing for the coming year.

The Day of Atonement is distinguished from most other holidays in that it is associated with no historical event. The day is purely an attempt at self-regeneration and at one with God. Although its roots reach far back into primitive times and may have some relation to an ancient equinoctial festival, the day received its present character in the Bible period.

Before the beginning of the Common Era, when the Temple in Jerusalem still stood, the high purposes of the day were expressed in rites of animal sacrifice, the common form of worship in the ancient world. Since the year 70, however, the central theme of the ritual has been Penitence, Prayer, and Righteous Action.

The melody of the Kol Nidre is heard at the evening service. This ancient and plaintive melody, together with the prayer of repentance, the sound of Shofar or ram's horn, the twenty-four hour fast and the promise of divine forgiveness all aid man in his quest for oneness with God and his struggle to lead the good life.

Morning Services will begin Wednesday at 7 o'clock. Memorial Services will be held at 10:30 followed by a greeting from Herman Kabakoff, second vice-president of the congregation. Rabbi Taxon will speak on "A Message From The Great Beyond."

Rabbi Taxon will deliver the sermon following the Yizkor service. Musaph Service will be at 12:15, followed by Minchah Service at 3:15. The Nehillah Sermon "Concluding or Beginning" by Rabbi Taxon will be given at 4:15. This will be followed by the Nehillah Service with Adjournment at 6:00 o'clock.

More than 150 Jewish leaders from all sections of the nation met in New York City on September 18 to attend the report meeting of the Plan and Scope Committee which guides the national campaign for \$5,000,000 of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

The leaders when they were assembled in the auditorium of the Chanin Building were addressed by Governor Herbert H. Lehman, of New York, a vice-chairman of the J. D. C.; James G. McDonald, chairman of President Roosevelt's Advisory Committee on Political Refugees, and former League of Nations High Commissioner for German Refugees; Joseph P. Chamberlain, professor of public law at Columbia University, who is chairman of the National Coordinating Committee; Paul Baerwald, chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee; Dr. Bernhard Kahn, European chairman

of the Joint Distribution Committee; Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, national chairman of the J. D. C. campaign; Joseph C. Hyman, executive director of the J. D. C.; Isidor Coons, national director of the J. D. C. campaign, and Harold K. Guinsburg, member of the J. D. C. Board of Directors who together with Rabbi Wise attended the Intergovernmental Refugee Conference at Evian where 32 nations conferred at the call of President Roosevelt.

The elevation of Dr. Bernhard Kahn, one of Europe's most noted welfare workers, to the new post of Honorary Chairman of the European Council of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee and the naming of Morris C. Troper, prominent New York Certified Public Accountant, to the chairmanship of the European Council, was announced by Paul Baerwald and James M. Rosenberg, J. D. C. chairman and vice-chairman, respectively, at a meeting held that day by the organization's Executive Committee.

NEED ANTI-JEWISH CRUSADE FOR GERMAN UNITY, HITLER EXPLAINS

Berlin (WNS) — Achievement of German unity makes necessary the crusade against the Jews, Chancellor Hitler declared in his final speech to the annual Nazi Party Congress at Nuremberg. "If it is asked why National Socialism today fights the Jews so fanatically," he said, "one can only answer that a foreign race, which has nothing in common with us, cannot be called upon to take the lead. Because we are National Socialists, we cannot permit an alien race to dominate us. We know that great tasks can be solved only by the whole people under an authoritarian government composed of the most capable sons of the people."

"We are fighting the Jews so fanatically because National Socialism wants to create a true unity of the nation. In this state even the poorest child must be able to ascend to the highest posts. This explains the struggle against a leadership foreign to the people. This is a preliminary condition for genuine national unity. This alone made it possible for us to solve the tasks others could not solve. Supported by the faith of the people, I succeeded in casting off the terrible shackles designed to enslave the people forever."

At another point in his address he assailed the democratic states, declaring "Germany and Italy are re-prepared for the brutality with which they eliminate their Jewish elements. As soon as the expulsion of the Jews from these countries started, the democracies made a great outcry of protest, but they took care not to aid the Jews. It was declared there was no place for them. It was declared that the world democratic empires, which have a scant few men to the square kilometer, could not support such a burden." Referring to the German Republic, he said its aim "was to establish a state such as we see in Soviet Russia—98 per cent Aryan workers and 2 per cent Jewish commissars."

AUSTRALIA MOVES TO ADMIT 5,000 JEWISH IMMIGRANTS.

Melbourne (WNS) — An official admission that Australia was about to modify its stringent immigration policy so as to admit 5,000 Jewish refugees during the current year was made by the Ministry of Interior in a brief but significant statement. The statement declared "The Australian government has agreed that during the current year 5,000 is the approximate number in all classes of Jewish applicants which might possibly be approved. This does not apply particularly to refugees, but would also include Jews whose admission was applied for by guarantors in Australia."

The statement is in striking contrast to the previous policy under which only 1,000 immigrants of all categories were admitted annually. It is reliably reported that the government will enable the admission of 50,000 Jewish immigrants during the next ten years. In anticipation of the coming of these immigrants the Australian Jewish Welfare Society called upon Australian Jewry to raise \$250,000 for immigration work.

MARCH 12 SET AS DEADLINE FOR EXPULSION OF ITALIAN JEWS.

Fascist Envoy to U. S. Gets Post Voted By Jew; Seen As Move To Eliminate Him As Suspected Jew.

Rome (WNS) — The appointment of Fulvio Suvich, Italian ambassador to the United States, as head of the Reunione Adriatica di Trieste, one of Italy's two biggest insurance companies, in place of Arnaldo Frigessi di Rattalma, a Jew, who was forced to resign as a result of the new anti-Semitic policy, is reported to be the first step in the ultimate elimination of Suvich from public life because of the fact that he, too, is said to be a Jew or of Jewish origin. At the same time, Edgardo Marpurgo, World War hero, was removed as head of the Assicurazioni Generali of Venice, the country's largest insurance company, and replaced by Count Guiseppe Volpi, former minister of finance.

Meanwhile, King Victor Emanuel, long regarded as a friend of the Jews and who was a close friend of the late Nahum Sokolow, put his signature to the cabinet decree of September 1 ordering the expulsion within six months of all Jews who settled in Italy since January 1, 1919. The decree sets March 12, 1939, as the deadline for compliance with the decree.

The Italian-Jewish weekly, "Israel," reports that the Union of Italian Jewish Communities has decided to set up courses in agriculture in every Hebrew school and to give every Jewish boy and girl over 13 training in handicrafts and mechanics in anticipation of new decrees excluding Jews from the professions. "Israel" declares that the execution of this re-training program is handicapped by lack of funds because the Italian government refuses to allow Italian Jews to receive financial aid from abroad.

LONG ILLNESS IS FATAL TO MAX GERBER

Max Gerber, father of City Attorney Will Gerber and retired merchant, died at his home, 1150 Monroe, Sunday morning following a long illness. He was 68 years old.

Mr. Gerber, a native of Russia, came to Memphis in 1906, a year after coming to the United States. He had lived here since. He was in the mercantile business until ill health caused his retirement 10 years ago.

He was a member of Baron Hirsch Synagogue and the Masonic Order. Mr. Gerber leaves his wife, a daughter, Mrs. Evelyn Isaacs of New York City, and five sons, Will, Morris and Joe of Memphis and Martin and Edward Gerber of Chicago.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon with Rabbi Morris N. Taxon officiating. Burial was in Baron Hirsch Cemetery.

ILLNESS FATAL TO MRS. BENSINGER

Mrs. Nannie Bensinger, artist and widow of Alf Bensinger, Memphis furniture dealer, died Sunday morning at her home 1939 Nelson, following an illness of six months. She was 70 years old.

Mrs. Bensinger was born in New York City and educated in schools there. She studied art in St. Louis. After living a number of years in Jackson, Tenn., where her husband was in the furniture business, she moved to Memphis about 38 years ago.

Widely known in Memphis art circles for her landscape scenes, Mrs. Bensinger's works have been exhibited in several Eastern cities.

She was a member of True Sisters and Congregation Children of Israel.

She leaves two sons, Lloyd B. and Julian Bensinger; a sister, Mrs. Rebecca Friede of St. Louis, and a brother, Joe Samuels of New York City.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday by Dr. Harry W. Ettelson. Burial was in Congregation Children of Israel Cemetery.

Pallbearers were J. C. Felsenthal, William Wolfe, Abe Wurzburg, Charles A. Gates, C. I. Levy, Lawrence Sternberger, Dave Halle and Milton Silberberg.

HEART ATTACK IS FATAL TO MRS. KATZ

Funeral services were held at the residence Sunday afternoon. Burial was in Anshei Sphard Cemetery.

B. B. HOME GUEST TAKEN BY DEATH

BEHIND THE CHANGE

A significant commentary on the increasing gravity of the world Jewish crisis is contained in the announcement made last week at the meeting of the plan and scope committee of the Joint Distribution Committee. The elevation of Dr. Bernhard Kahn to the new post of honorary chairman of the European council of the J. D. C. and the naming of Morris C. Troper to the chairmanship—a post held by Dr. Kahn for nearly 15 years—may at first glance appear to be a routine change of administrative personnel. Probing deeper, however, reveals a different picture.

Dr. Kahn is one of the most distinguished social workers on the European continent to day—Scholar, diplomat, humanitarian and organizer, his record of accomplishment in social service extends back over four decades. Extraordinarily well-informed on every phase of European life which affects Jewish interests, Dr. Kahn has at his fingertips the knowledge, background and penetrating insight which make him an expert and veteran observer of European affairs. It is primarily for this reason, when complex currents and cross-currents make European events more and more puzzling to the average American, that the officers and directors of J. D. C. felt it urgent that Dr. Kahn spend the greater portion of his time in the United States, where he might be able to give of his experience in the guidance of J. D. C.

policy. American Jews, ever eager for enlightenment, welcome him in their midst. The J. D. C. is to be congratulated on its choice of Mr. Troper as chairman of the European executive council. Mr. Troper has built for himself a reputation for sound judgment, tact and executive ability which speaks well for his career as chief of the J. D. C. overseas bureau.

For the American Jewish public at large there is a definite inference to be drawn.

When the J. D. C. considers it all-important to have immediately available its most seasoned expert, and at the same time senses that events abroad are such that only a younger man can bear the physical strain of exacting administrative duties, the situation confronting Jews abroad is of so dangerous a nature as to demand our most earnest attention.

B'NAI B'RITH TRIUMPH

One of the principal raisons d'être for youth auxiliaries to Jewish organizations is the desire of the parent body to have a source from which to draw future members and leaders. Offhand we can't think of any well known leader of a national Jewish organization in this country who is a product of a Jewish youth organization. The reason for this is that most youth organizations are still too young to have produced men and women of leadership calibre. But B'rith B'rith, which has two youth adjuncts, the Aleph Zadek Aleph and the Hillel Foundations, has come closest to it.

Last week it was announced that Dr. Isaac Rabinowitz, 30-year old educator, had been appointed director of the Hillel Foundation at the University of Michigan. This appointment is a triumph for B'nai B'rith's youth auxiliaries, for Dr. Rabinowitz is an alumnus of both A. Z. A. and Hillel. He was an early member of the Kansas City chapter of A. Z. A., the second to be organized, and was also a protégé of the late Rabbi Frankel, who founded the Hillel Foundation movement.

Mrs. Schwarz is publicity chairman of the Michigan Hillel becomes the first in B'nai B'rith's network of 12 student foundations to get one of its own products as director.

If this appointment does nothing else than justify the existence of Jewish youth organization it will be of great value. We can expect, however, that in the not distant future young men and women now active in other Jewish youth groups will become the key figures in American Jewish leadership.

I had been troubled about something I had read in the daily press and I guess it was for that reason that I caused Mr. Death to come to this typewriter. From what I had read in the press I gathered that hereafter Jews in Italy would not only not be allowed to live but their right to die was not going to be recognized.

Hereafter (it has been ordered) no Italian newspaper may print the report of a Jew's death. It is to be as if he had never lived or died.

Oh, I said, it seems that Mr. Mussolini can not hope to compete with his German collaborator in numbers of Jews destroyed, since Germany has so many more Jews than Italy; therefore Mr. Mussolini is applying himself to the refinements of brutality.

If Mr. Mussolini can't be as big a brute as Hitler he seems determined to be a more artistic one (if one can speak of art among the savages). But the comparative viciousness of two brutes did not concern me much.

What concerned me more was that the death of a Jew was no longer to be recognized in Italy. Suppose (I asked myself) this is carried farther: Suppose Mussolini decrees that then and thereafter Jews shall not be allowed to die, just as they are no longer allowed to go to public schools, or to hold public office, or to engage in private business.

Suppose, indeed, that Mr. Mussolini conceives the ultimate cruelty: He announces that thereafter Jews will not be allowed to escape him by dying. Jews, he orders, must not die. The right to die therewith is withdrawn from all Italian Jews.

With the facility with which he caused the Italians to be made a pure-blooded race, he orders the professors to prepare an essence that will prevent Italian Jews from dying. This should not be impossible to professors who merely by writing a pamphlet caused all Italians to be 100 per cent pure-blooded Aryans.

All this was most troubling, for the blessed right to die is all that Jews in Italy (as in Germany) have left in the world. I am glad to give assurance from good Mr. Death himself that they can't take that away.

"Thank you, sir," I said, "There is, after all, so much left to the Jews—your justice which knows not Aryan from Jew, your hospitable graves which will embrace (without prejudice) even Hitler and Mussolini, your kindness which gives peace to men for whom there is no other kindness in the world, your impartiality which has one law."

Lo! The right to die is the only right left to a people, and even that right while still tolerated is not to be recognized in the public prints of Italy.

SALUTE TO DEATH

This evening, at my typewriter, I am speaking with Mr. Death, as one can easily do at a typewriter. I have just saluted him.

I had been afraid of Mr. Death ever since I first encountered him in my remote childhood. I saw him first in the house of the little girl across the street who had been killed by a street car. I went over to look at her. She was so very white, for then the undertakers had not yet acquired the art by which they now give the dead the verisimilitude of life.

It was then I first became acquainted with Mr. Death. The house smelled of tea roses of which there were several bouquets on the girl's coffin. Ever since, whenever I have smelled tea roses, I have thought of Mr. Death. He was a grisly skeletal specter that day in my youth.

But now at my typewriter I have been saluting Mr. Death. I am one of those who privately applaud the

friends of Jews (though in my public writings I deplore the practice of making much over those who befriend us). It seems too much like a grateful dog licking the hand of his benefactor.

"Mr. Death," I said, "I thank you sincerely. You are the only friend Jews have in some places."

Mr. Death, as he sits at my desk, is not the dreadful figure that I saw in my youth at the little girl's house. Mr. Death is a benign old gentleman with the kindest of eyes. He seems some gentle old father who is always ready to take the children in when they come home from their troubles in the bitter world.

"Mr. Death," I said, "you are so fair and so brave against dictators. Even in Germany and Italy you make no discrimination against Jews. You let them die equally with all other men."

Mr. Death deprecated this praise. He said he had always made it his policy to have one law for all men. He would never change this—not even in the countries where they have one law for Jews and another law for other people. He said he was no respecter of anybody; he treated everybody alike.

"But, Mr. Death, you are the only sure refuge that Jews have left. You alone have peace and kindness and justice for them. I am writing this piece especially in your honor."

Mr. Death answered that he always had tried to be fair. He wasn't going to take up the current practice that denies justice and equality as the right of some people. He would keep on treating everybody alike. People are people.

Tidbits From Everywhere

Political Palaver
Anti-Semitism seems due to play a considerable part in this year's Congressional elections. William Rufus Scott, candidate for Congress in the 16th California district (Los Angeles) has sent out mimeographed postcards headed "JEWS IN UNITED STATES IMPERILED BY NEW DEAL FOLLIES!" in an attempt to stir Jews to vote against New Deal candidates by creating the fear that if the New Deal program is not stopped it will lead to bankruptcy and subsequent attacks on Jews. In that torrid New York primary fight Congressman John J. O'Connor's campaign manager sent every voter in the district a copy of Father Coughlin's magazine Social Justice containing a laudatory article on O'Connor and also the 13th and 14th "Protocols of the Elders of Zion". P. S.—O'Connor was defeated by the Democrats, but won the Republican nomination. The Republicans in Minnesota are charged with sponsoring an underground whispering campaign against Governor Benson who has a Jewish secretary, in the hope of alienating the large German vote. Those Nazis awaiting trial in New York on charges of espionage against Uncle Sam's defense forces were assigned to get the plans of a sensational new bomb sighter invented by American army engineers. Edward Banta, one of the witnesses before the Dies Committee in New York, spoke before the New York branch of the Friends of New Germany, predecessor of the Bund, in 1934. Those in the know insist that Los Angeles Nazis responsible for the frequent bombing of that city by air with anti-Semitic leaflets were recently given a going over by anti-Nazis, who smashed the Nazis' printing press. Prince Habertus Loewenstein, the anti-Nazi German Catholic nobleman, is at work unifying all anti-Nazi Germans into a solid bloc. New York hospital supply manufacturers stuck with German-made goods have got rid of them by donating them to the committee equipping a relief ship for the Spanish Loyalists. Archbishop Edward Mooney of Detroit, who put the quietus on Father Coughlin in 1937, is a good bet to succeed the late Patrick Cardinal Hayes. The schools of medicine and dentistry of Howard University, a Negro institution in Washington from which quite a few Jews have graduated, are now limiting the number of Jews admitted.

Behind The Front
Diplomatic insiders at London and Geneva will tell you that behind the Arab terror in Palestine is no Arab brain but a three-man brain trust comprising an American from Illinois, who serves as banker, Gustave Schmeller, a German archeologist, who directs the smuggling of arms, and Fawzi Bey, a Turk and a veteran of the Austrian army, who is the military strategist. Sir Oswald Mosley, who has been a widower for several years, will soon announce his forthcoming marriage to Mrs. Bryan Guinness, sister of Unity Mitford, the enthusiastic pro-Nazi English lady friend of Hitler. Mrs. Guinness, like her sister, is a hot Hitlerite. The government of Northern Ireland is working to bring from Austria Jewish re-

fugees who are key workers in important industries that can be transferred to Belfast. The Austrian Nazis are so well-informed on Jewish affairs that when Zionist leaders call at Gestapo headquarters in Vienna they are offered copies of the Davar and Haaretz, Palestinian Hebrew dailies. And when the Nazis speak of Weizmann and Jabotinsky they refer to them familiarly as Chaim and Jabo. One of the great mysteries is the daily appearance of swastikas on the facade of the famous Rothschild Synagogue. The swastikas appear every morning, and no amount of watching has succeeded in preventing their being smeared on. Jimmy Hines, the Tammany leader who pushed Hitler off the front page by winning a mistrial, will get a laugh when he's told that the Frankfurter Zeitung editorially called him a Jew. Some \$60,000,000 has already been stolen by the 800 Nazi commissars who took over Jewish businesses in Vienna. Nice going, boys. Arab extremists are bragging that they are perfecting plans to assassinate Chaim Weizmann.

Jewish Jottings
All future Zionist functions will have a new record to shoot at as a result of the unprecedented achievement of the sponsors of the dinner to Dr. Solomon Goldman, Zionist prexy, in New York. There were only two speeches, one by Dr. Goldman and the other by Dr. Stephen S. Wise, the chairman. The Reconstructionist, organ of Dr. Mordecai M. Kaplan's Reconstructionist Movement will publish a startling announcement by its founder very soon. Now that Italy is talking of colonizing Jews in Ethiopia we can tell you that one of New York's important department store magnates and Palestine leaders offered, way back in 1936, to send an important Jewish woman to Ethiopia to study Jewish colonization possibilities. Dr. Abba Hillel Silver has been appointed to, and has accepted, the post of national chaplain of the Jewish War Veterans. That organization, incidentally, is considering changing its name to American Jewish War Veterans. Unless the Independent Order B'rith Abraham wants people to think it's trying to exploit for its own ends the name and reputation of the B'nai B'rith Anti-Defamation League it had better change the name of its new Anti-Discrimination, Anti-Defamation and Good Will League. New Jersey Jewish Center leaders are pleased as Punch at the return of Charles Nemeser, former executive director of the Jersey City Jewish Center, who has been named the Jewish Welfare Board's field secretary for New Jersey. Clap hands for Jacob Billikopf and Samuel Kohns, who are doing a honey of a job with the resettlement division of the National Coordinating Committee for German Refugees in distributing refugees over the country.

About People
Gino Olivetti, Italian Jewish industrialist who has been forced to resign from two important government positions, is one of the official Italian representatives at the International Management Congress at Washington. If you're wondering why you haven't heard from Sam Untermeyer lately we can tell you that he's gravely ill. Myron Weiss, who was the only Jewish editor on the staff of Time Magazine, is out after a lash with publisher Luce. Weiss wrote all the medical items. Some friends of Meyer W. Weisgal, who left for Palestine a week ago to inspect the exhibits being built there for the Jewish Palestine Pavilion at the New York World's Fair, presented him with a bullet-proof vest as a parting gift. Arturo Toscanini is so mad at Mussolini that when Il Duce sent the maestro's brother to win back his friendship, Toscanini said that if he ever meets Benito he'll spit in his eye. Did you know that Cyrus Adler once took boxing lessons from Jake Kilrain who lasted 48 rounds against the immortal Sullivan. Within the next few weeks James Waterman Wise, son of Stephen S. Wise, will make public an announcement which will create somewhat of a sensation. It will mark, in a sense, Jimmie's return to a great Jewish cause. The attorney for Miss Deanna Durbin demands that we retract our statement that this charming movie star is Jewish—although it is no crime, nor libel, in this country to call a movie star a Jewess. So, notwithstanding the fact that the source of our information insists that Deanna is non-Aryan, we comply with the attorney's request. Professor Jekuthiel Ginsburg of Yeshiva College, editor of Scripta Mathematica, is a very happy man these days. The two albums "Portraits of Great Mathematicians" recently published under Scripta auspices are among the contents of the "time capsule" which is being buried in the New York

World's Fair grounds to preserve samples of our present-day American civilization for posterity, 5,000 years hence. For the first time in the history of the University of Oklahoma a Jew has been elected president of the senior class. He is Alfred Slaner, whose family are the only Jews in the town of Hobart, Okla. Latest alumnus of the Anglo-Jewish press to make good in other spheres is Sidney Kaufman, movie critic, who's giving a course on the cinema at the New School for Social Research. Some of the subjects with which he will deal are, the films under Fascism and the treatment of minorities in the movies. Prof. Louis Ginzberg, the great Talmudic scholar of the Jewish Theological Seminary, showed what he thought of his former student, Dr. Solomon Goldman, by making his first public appearance in years at the Goldman dinner in N. Y. Congressman Sol Bloom of New York, who has long been palsy-walsy with Mussolini, has removed some of Il Duce's personally autographed photographs from his walls.
